

ALLAN MOELLER SR

DRIVER, CAR OWNER

Allan Moeller is the epitome of what Wiscasset Speedway is all about – hard work, resiliency, sportsmanship, and just plain having fun racing cars – and he’s done it for a long time, longer than nearly any driver to come through the gates of Maine’s fastest track. Allan broke onto the scene in 1978 as a young man in the Street Stocks and, other than taking a year or two off from time to time, has been racing and winning ever since. Although he got off to a slow start – his first win didn’t come until 1996, his love of racing and competing kept him going and the wins – and championships – eventually started piling up. His first round of success came big in the late 1990’s to early 2000’s as he picked up wins in Super Streets, Super Limiteds, and Modifieds. Over that time, he won 25 races and 2 titles (2002 Superlimited, 2003 Modified) in 7 years. He also picked up a 100-lap win in 2001 that he lists as the highlight win of his long career. The next decade Allan raced parttime and for a while turned the seat over to his son Allan Jr, leading him to a handful of wins. But a racer needs to race, so Sr got back behind the wheel and knabbed another championship in the 2008 Super Street campaign. Again, things appeared to slow down in Allan’s career with the track shutting down in 2010. But once again, Wiscasset came back to life and Allan Moeller was there to race. With the resurgence of the Modified class, he grabbed some more wins and then in 2017 won his 4th track title, making history as the track’s oldest champion at 63 years young. All told, Allan Moeller Sr has won 33 races and 4 championships in his 40+ year career and in 2021 is still having fun doing it. Congratulations to Allan on his induction into the Wiscasset Speedway Hall of Fame.
