Winslow's Bob Hallee had an eventful racing career that spanned over 30 years at tracks all around the state of Maine. It actually was two different stints in the game that culminated into his induction into the Maine Motorsports Hall of Fame in 2013. Part one of his career started in 1965 at Unity Raceway and then Speedway 95 where he quickly started winning races and established himself as one to watch. He took home the 1974 Hobby title at Unity and also ventured down to Wiscasset and won several Hobby races as well in the early 70's. At one point he had won 6 straight races at Wiscasset and (as was customary back then) a bounty was put up for the first driver to beat him. That driver to end his streak was Dennis Morgan. Then, in the 80's Bob stepped away from racing with what already had already been a HoF worthy career. But he eventually returned to Wiscasset in the mid 90's in the Limited Sportsman class and put together one of the most dominant stretches of success in the tracks history. In just four seasons, from 1996 to 1999, Bob amassed and amazing 23 wins and 57 top 3 finishes, topped off by a pair of championships. The quiet spoken driver also picked up a pair of Sportsmanship awards and was voted the track's Most Popular Driver in 1998. Following the 1999 season Bob decided it was time to hang it up for good and enjoy time with his wife Joyce and family. With over 100 career wins, nearly 40 of them coming at Wiscasset, a handful of championships, and countless memories, Bob still looks back on all the people he met and friends he made in racing among his fondest memories. Now he takes his rightful place in Wiscasset Speedway's Hall of Fame.
