Ken Seigers was one of the men who had a large part in getting Wiscasset Speedway up and running in its early days. Already an established racer at other area tracks, Seigers came to Wiscasset in 1969 and took his place on the track's original Board of Directors under the direction of track owner Wilford Cronk. While he saw marginal success on the track with a handful of wins in his familiar #B-2 in the Late Model division, he played a much larger role off the track. Ken was heavily involved helping to get other drivers into the sport and onto the track, providing cars and parts to many of his fellow competitors. His name and legacy have remained at the forefront of Wiscasset Speedway's history long after his death in 1980. His daughters Ellen, Brenda, and Rowena have stayed in the area and raised families. He was the grandfather of the late Mike Moody who rose to stardom at Wiscasset Speedway in the early 80's before his untimely death. Ken's great grandson Mike Moody is a 2-time champion himself and continues his own 20+ year racing career on a part time basis.
