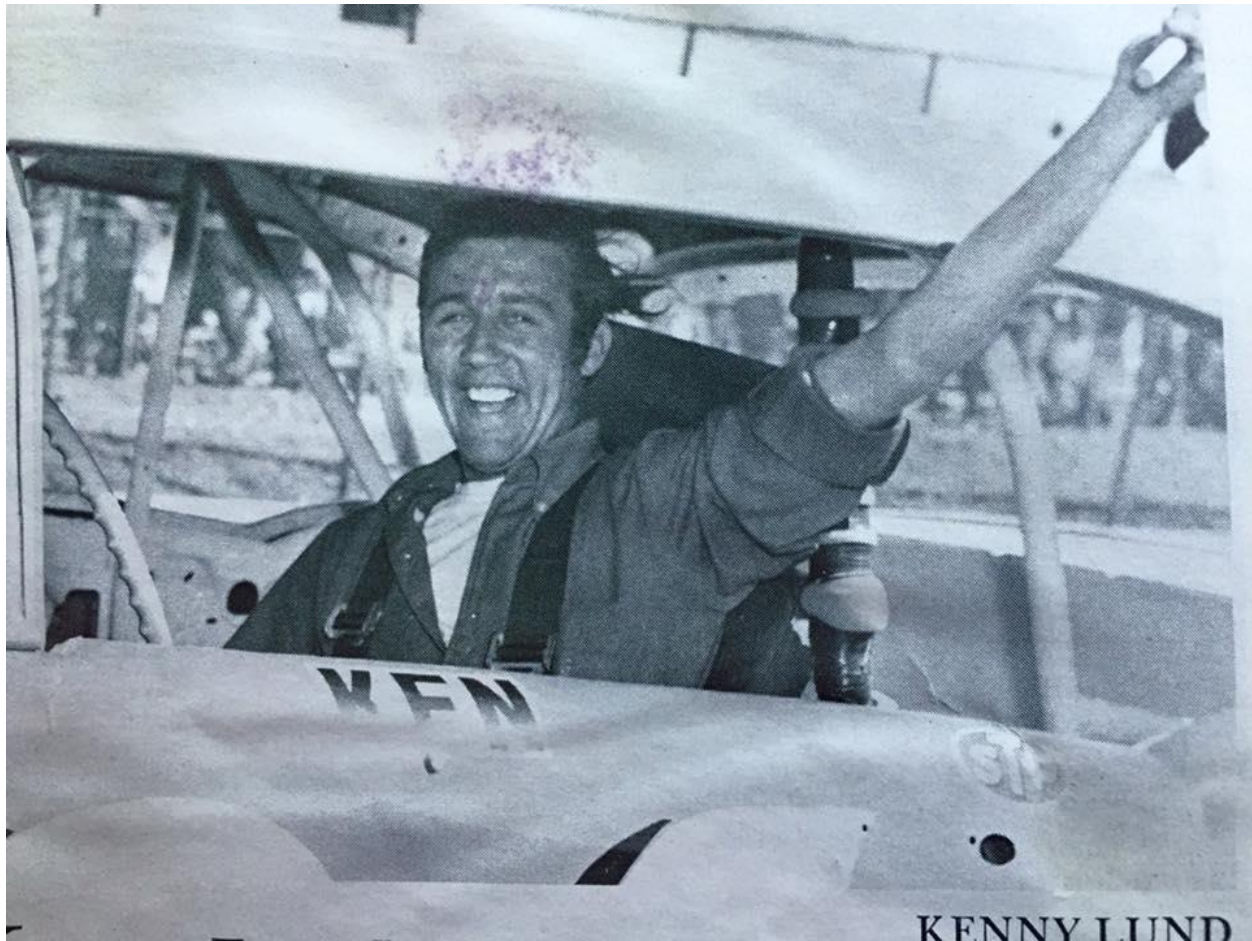


## KENNY LUND

DRIVER



Kenny Lund is considered one of the “pioneers” of Wiscasset Speedway. An established star and champion at Beech Ridge Motor Speedway, in 1969 Kenny brought his talents up the coast to try Wilford Cronk’s brand-new Wiscasset Speedway. He found success right out of the gate, winning races, and collecting trophies in the Hobby Division. As a matter of fact, he won nearly all the races in the first two years he competed at Wiscasset. He won first 10 Hobby Class races run until he was beat mid 1970 – and if he didn’t win, you would still see the driver of the #24 on the podium picking up a 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> place trophy. In flipping through early programs of Wiscasset’s first two seasons it was a rare occasion to not see Kenny’s winning smile in victory lane. Another great thing about Kenny Lund is that he did not keep his winning formula to himself. He was always willing to help a young “up-and-coming” driver. Hall of Famer Teddy Palino shared “if it wasn’t for Kenny Lund, I may not have gotten into racing or have been as successful as I was. He helped me a lot”. Kenny Lund’s career success, which included 4 titles at Beech Ridge and 2 at Wiscasset landed him in the Maine Racing Hall of Fame in 2013 and this year he is welcomed into the 2020 class of the Wiscasset Speedway Hall of Fame.
